



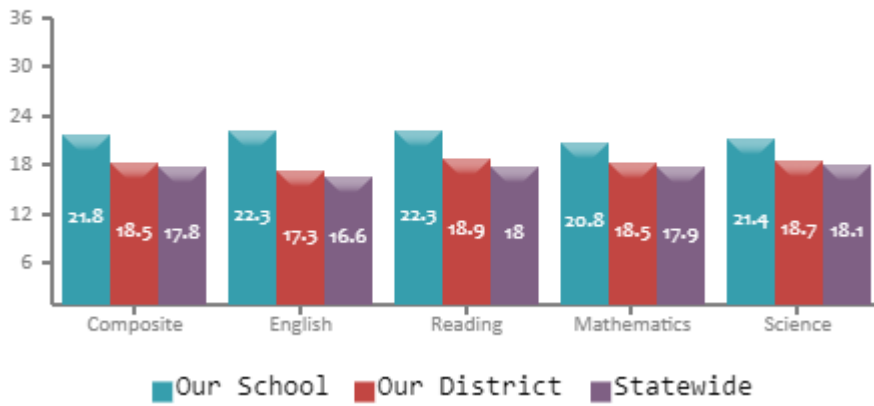

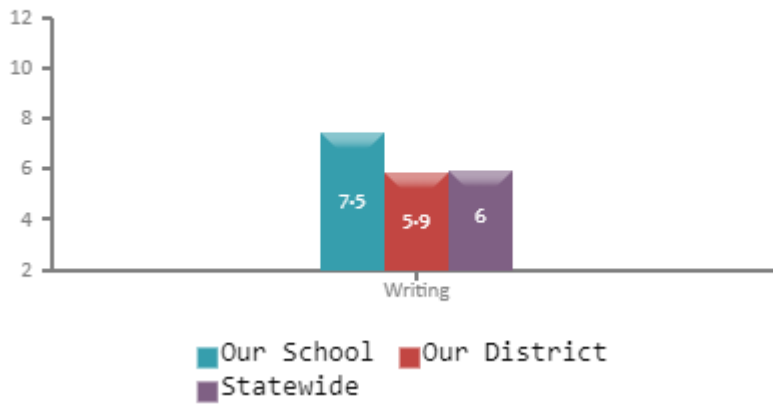

Average ACT Score Achieved by Students: Writing, 2017

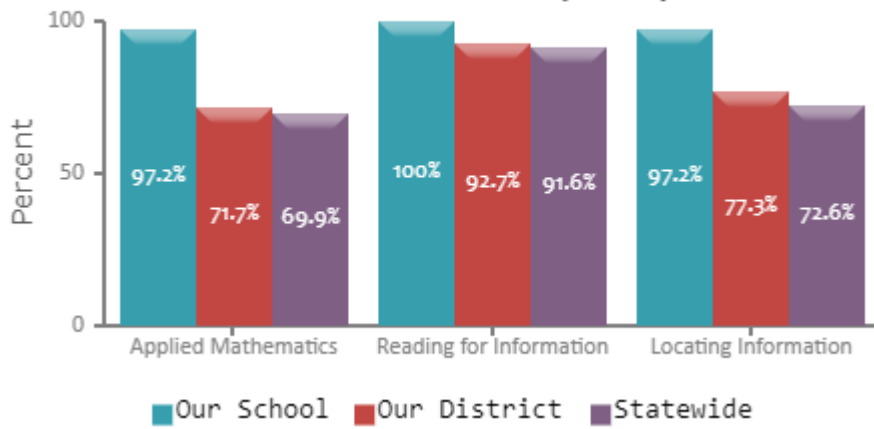
